

What Should I Bring?



There is very limited space on board! Your personal storage space (not including your sleeping bag and rain gear) is approximately 24" X 12" X 10". Be conservative when packing! You must use soft unframed luggage (duffle bag, etc.). **No suitcases or framed backpacks are allowed.** Do not bring valuables.

Identification

Proof of citizenship is required. This includes original birth certificates or passports for Canadian and American born students and appropriate original documentation for others (passport, immigration papers, visa, etc.).

Items Not To Bring

- electronics such as CD players or cell phones
- framed packs or suitcases - bring a duffel bag
- sandals
- pierced ears: must be empty or with studs. No hoops.
- makeup, perfume, hair spray
- knives (rigging knives are used only by the officers)
- alcohol and illegal substances

Spending Money

This depends entirely upon individuals, but many bring approximately \$25 to \$50 per week to cover shore leave, etc.

Safe Keeping

At the beginning of each cruise, money and/or other valuables such as identification may be given to the Captain and locked away for safe-keeping. Remember to bring your Original Birth Certificate for all trips including American ports of call.

Note: Any prescription drugs must be given to the Captain for safe-keeping.

Labelling your clothing and belongings is a good idea.
